Stephen L. Barstow was a board member at West Midland Family Center from 1983 to 1992, and one of the guiding forces toward the development of our new center. Stephen's death from a brain tumor on August 3, 1992 was deeply felt by the WMFC family. In Stephen's name, the Barstow Foundation has generously donated \$25,000 to the center's endowment fund. The earnings from this contribution will help support family health and wellness education programming at WMFC.


In 1995, we will be using these funds for family wellness instruction through the Building Strong Families parenting program. Through this program, young parents will have access to wellness education and activities for themselves and their children. In addition to health and wellness instruction,

Building Strong Family participants will ive a free orientation of our fitness facilities as well as ongoing free access to the fitness program. Each class, participants will receive free snacks and recipes and improving lifestyles and behavior will be an

ongoing goal for the program.

For the past three years, Lois Burton, the program's coordinator, has offered weekly

WMFC Looks Forward to Another Exciting Summer

WMFC's summer program schedule has some exciting new additions this year. As well as our tried and true **Bookworm Buddies** and "Sun"sational Summer programs, new additions to our youth programs include the Early Bird Club, Shuttle Service and Chippewa Nature Center Camp. The Early Bird Club will be offered from 7:30 to 10:00 am before our regular programs start. The program is educationally focused library program ideally suited to children of working parents and those children who need extra summer tutoring. Our Shuttle Service will be a four stop, bus pick up for families in outlying areas.

Perhaps our most exciting new program for summer is the Chippewa Nature Center (CNC) Camp. For a full week between August 7 and 11, WMFC will be host to CNC's quality science and exploration camp. The camp will offer four age appropriate groups including half day programs for preschoolers and kindergarten students and full day programs for students in grades one through three. We are very grateful to Chippewa Nature Center for selecting us as an outreach site for their summer program. We are able to offer their program at a much lower cost than the normal rates.

In addition to our regular programming we will be offering a number of special one day activities for area families. These include a July 4th Community Picnic hosted by our Teens in Training members.

We are also offering Family Picnics and Youth Camp Outs on June 9, July 13 and August 10. A campfire supper will begin at 6:00 pm for all family members. At 9:00 pm parents can go home for a relaxing evening while the 9 to 14 year olds stay behind for a camp out with the WMFC staff. Registration for all summer programs begins June 1 between 6:00 - 8:00 pm.
