




Point of View




- Shoot up on objects to make them more powerful.
- Shoot down on subjects to diminish them or make them look less imposing.






Check the **Edges of Frames**

- Don't cut off hands and feet of your subject half way. To exclude appendages crop well above the appendage. Example: Hands...crop well above the wrist











- This car needs space to move, leaving space on the right allows for movement.


 The lines in the road enforce the sense of movement


 Tilting the camera emphasizes the strong diagonals















- Watch out for who, or what, is in the background or coming out
- of the edges.


 Fill the frame to limit background distractions


 Choose your camera position to eliminate what is in the background of your picture.

































































Other Suggestions

- Use captions to add information to an article that has not been covered in the article.










A Hawk Moth visit results in an opportunity for childcare students to get a quick STEM lesson on flight from a WMFC Childcare provider.
