## "Back on the Rack" Coming Soon

There is always something exciting happening at *West Midland Family Center* (WMFC). WMFC continues to repurpose



"We have contracts with the Walmart stores in Midland, Mt. Pleasant, Alma and Bay City," explained Roth. "Typically, I pick up one or two pallets of goods each week, from each store. Let me tell you, they can get a lot of stuff on just one pallet!" current facility spaces and implement new programming to meet the growing needs of the community it serves. Currently WMFC is in the process of making a big move to help the community in yet another innovative way. Within the next few months, what was once the *WMFC Clothing Room*, will morph into a community repurposed goods outlet.

For three decades, WMFC has collected donations and facilitated the distribution of gently used second-hand clothing out of the WMFC Clothing Room. The clothing room has served the community well over the years but now there are new plans for this space that WMFC believes will help families even more.

In August 2018, WMFC entered into partnership with the *Walmart Corporation* with the intention of re-purposing merchandise from area Walmart stores that either didn't sell or had been returned. In the past, these items would have gone into a dumpster because they could not be resold or stored.

As a result of the collaboration with Walmart, WMFC has been able to distribute an estimated \$1,000,000 worth

of household merchandise to the community in the last four years. Merchandise has included such things as bedding, curtains, flatware, dishes, towels, clothing, toys, pet food, electronics and personal care products to name a few. The partnership between WMFC and Walmart allows for the aforementioned items to now be put into the hands of those in the community who need them. As a result, the distribution program fills in crucial gaps for WMFC families as they struggle to cope with today's rising food prices and higher cost of living.

"Our collaboration has been wonderful. The Walmart staff members are such a great group to work with! They enjoy being part of a program that helps get needed goods into the hands of those in the community," shared *Helen Roth, WMFC Connect and Serve Coordinator* 

"I'm so pleased that WMFC is a part of this endeavor. It's rewarding to provide people with nice things that they wouldn't have a means to purchase," stated *Greg Dorrien, WMFC Executive Director*. "With tons of overstock coming to the Center weekly, Helen intentionally devised procedures to store and manage product before distribution to the community. The logistics involved and resulting space constraints led to strategic planning sessions which ended with a very logical and natural conclusion. We now plan to use the space currently designated to *used* clothing distribution, to prepare and distribute *new/unused* items received from Walmart."

"Once we get the new space up and running," smiled Roth, "I think we'll name it "Back on the Rack"...it seems fitting."

Jeff was hired in 2001 as the Midland Family Center Maintenance and **Facilities** Director. In the thirteen years Jeff worked at WMFC he was passionate about the mission of the Center and the services the Center provided to families. Sadly, November 24, 2022, our big-hearted friend left us for what he knew to be, a better world.

"Jeff worked with volunteer *Greg Janoch* to reduce energy usage throughout the facility...originally changing all the ballasts and florescent lights before LED bulbs came about," shared *Greg Dorrien, WMFC Executive Director.* "Jeff had worked for an area hospital before joining WMFC. He brought a level of best practice professionalism with him, and had a great relationship with many vendors who helped get us great service during emergencies and with day-to-day troubleshooting."

After leaving employment, due to disability, in 2014, Jeff continued to volunteer at the Center in whatever capacity he could be of help.

Passion. That is the word that best describes Jeff Myers. If he was spending his time at something, he was 110% passionate about it. First and foremost, Jeff had a passion for

helping people. He loved to love people. He was always generous with his time and everything he had. He'd help anyone in need, and then he'd give the shirt off his back, if they needed more. There was no end to the lengths he'd go to help someone.

"Jeff was one of the most giving and thoughtful people I've ever worked with. He had such a huge heart for the community, his coworkers and WMFC," shared *Jason Green, WMFC CFO*.

Jeff had a passion for homesteading, gardening, cooking and his family.

"Jeff was a kind, big hearted friend...and was always good for laugh," shared WMFC Office Manager, Missy Finney. "He had a love for food.... especially spicy...sometimes a little too spicy for some of us! But nothing was more important to Jeff than his grandchildren, he loved to spend as much time as possible with them," continued Finney. "He always had a fun story to tell about what they were doing together, whether is was cooking or taking care of the goats or chickens.

Jeff loved music and playing his guitar.

"I'd often walk by his office door and hear him strumming on his guitar during a break. It was how he relaxed. He also loved his dog, Charlie. We all did. That's why Charlie was the unofficial WMFC mascot back in the day," shared
